Jeff states that he feels the finance committee has a good understanding of where the numbers are and proceeds with an overview and breakdown of how the budget is set up;

REVENUE:

 - The biggest portion of our budget comes from the commercial property owners DTOP as they have a special line item on their tax bill which funds our budget.
 - Village gets money from the county and gives it to DTOP.
 - This does not include condo buildings.

RESERVES:

What are reserves for? We put aside for the years when we are over budget and supplement. For example, we have reserves for when there's an excess amount of snow.

- \$50,000 in reserves
