Finance Report – Jeff Eng

Page 1 - SSA: The 3rd Quarter SSA was received from the Village in August.

Page 2 - Sasseti: The expenses for this year's audit totaled \$9,640. Sasseti is over budget for this year because the final bill for last year's audit was paid in January when the invoice was received. Sasseti was asked to send all invoices within the year of occurrence in the future.

Page 3 - Thursday Night Out: TNO Expenses came in right on budget, around \$30,000.

Page 3 - Advertising and Promotions: Total Advertising is under budget and Total Promotions is over budget, as more emphasis has been placed on promoting the merchants as the COVID pandemic continues.

Page 4 - Extra Reserve and Snow Reserve Accounts: The Extra Reserves now total \$142,747 and Snow Reserves total \$55,046.

Page 5 - Thursday Night Out: The total TNO books sold was \$93,320 vs. \$149,380 in 2019, and \$56,650 has been redeemed to merchants vs. \$105,813 in 2019.

Page 5 - Gift Certificates: The total Gift Certificates sold was \$21,775 vs. \$10,290 last year, and \$37,540 has been redeemed to merchants vs. \$8,240 last year.
