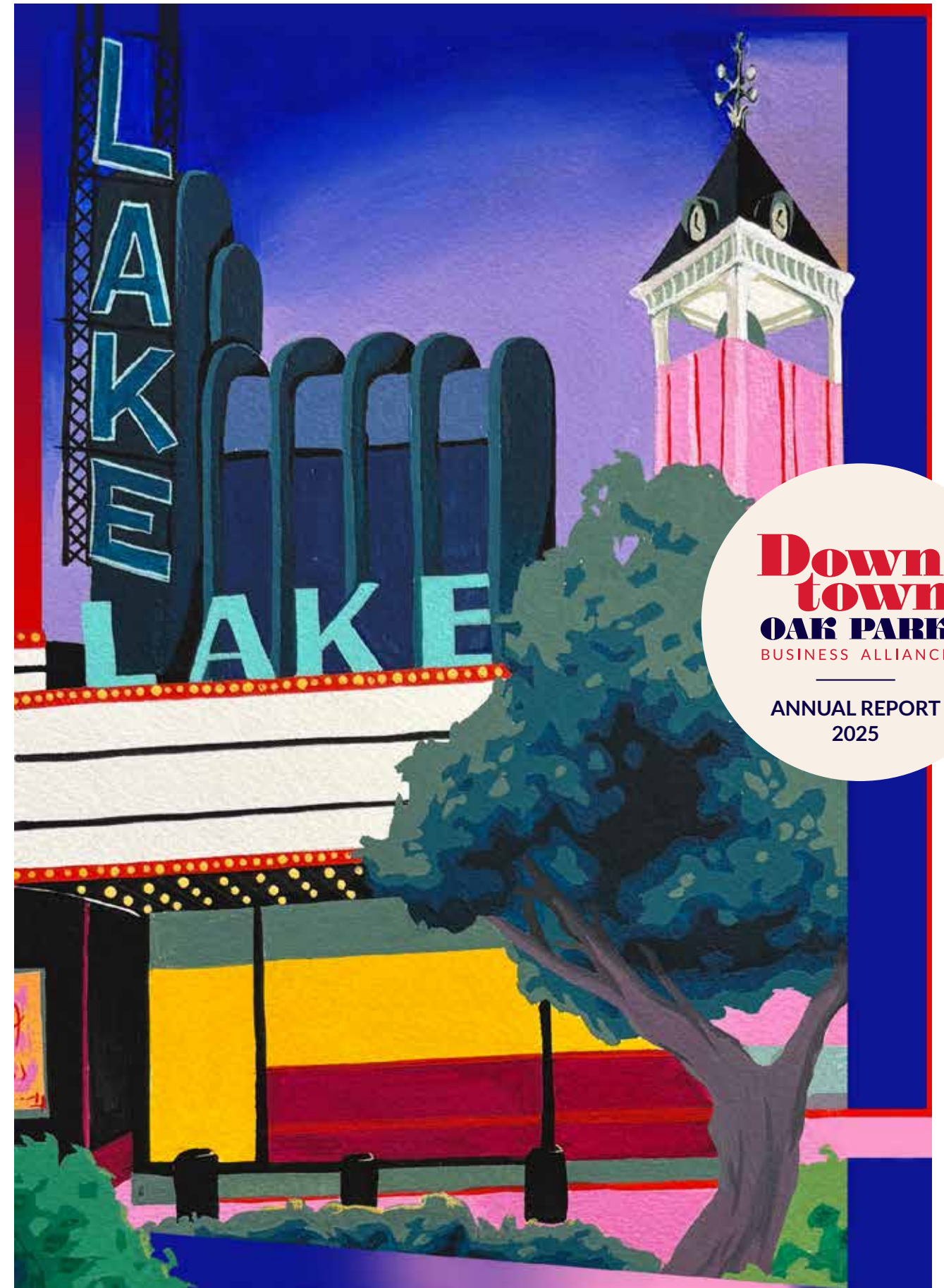

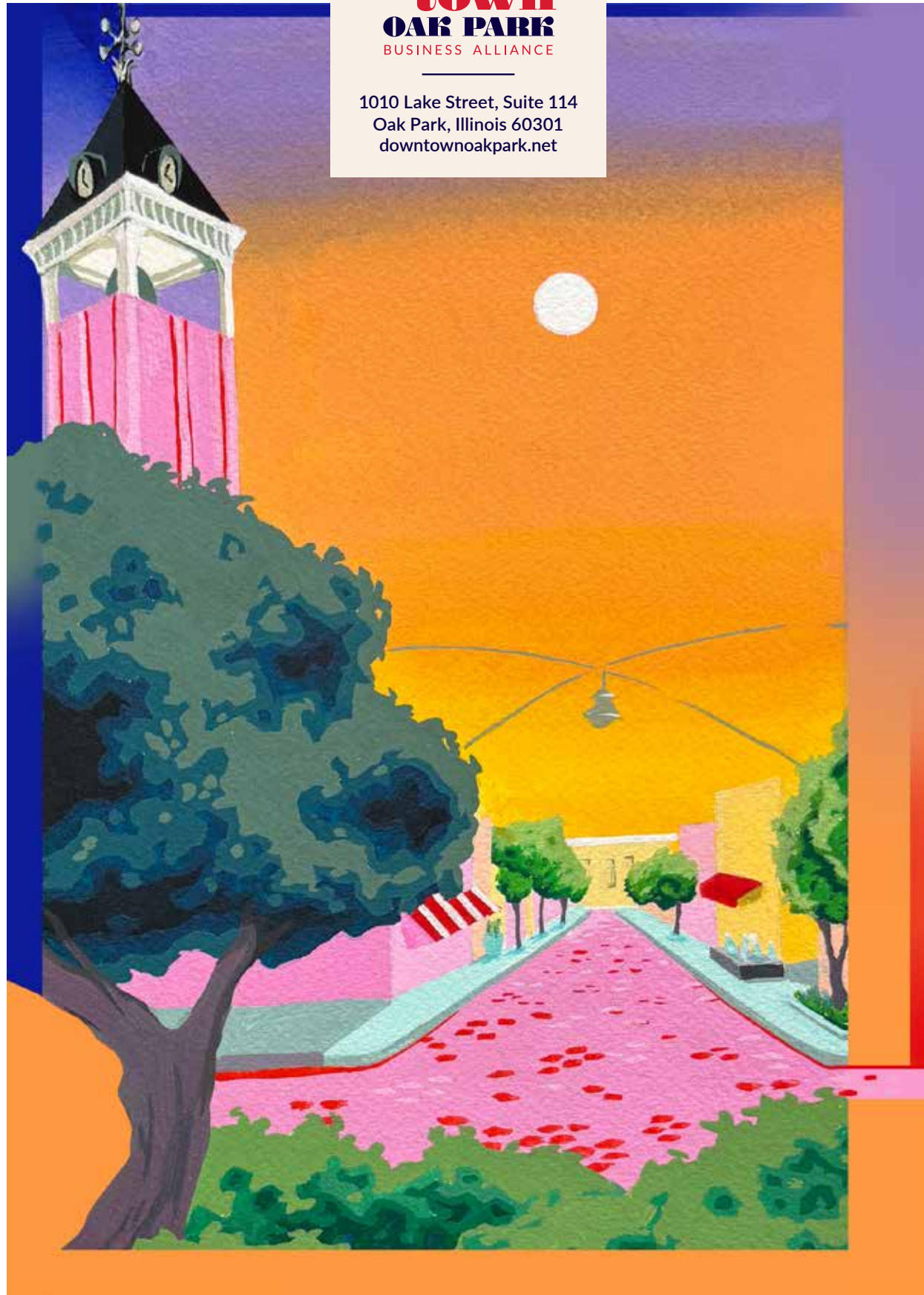

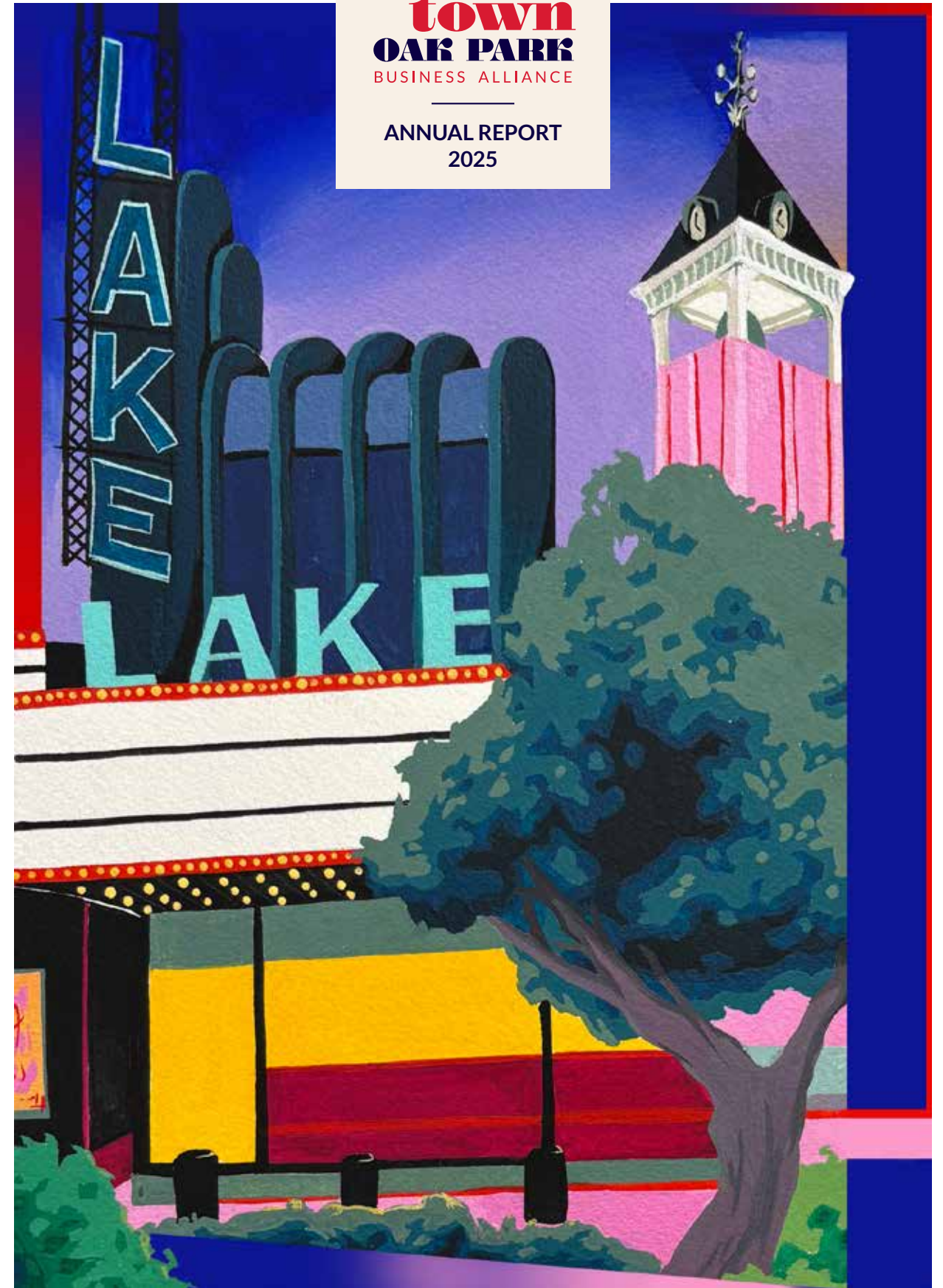

Letter from the President

May 2026

To Our Downtown Oak Park Community,

Looking back at the 2025 season, it is clear that the Downtown Oak Park Business Alliance has completed another successful year. The foundation of our success, as always, is our commitment to refreshing our events—Thursday Night Out—and updating our promotions—Shopper’s Reward. These efforts ensure that our downtown remains the premier destination for foodies, families, and fashionistas!

Oaktoberfest: A Vibrant New Look

For the 30th Anniversary of Oaktoberfest, we refreshed our brand to better reflect the energy and diversity of our community. After soliciting feedback from our MAC committee, we launched a campaign that focused on “fresh, clean, and diverse colors.” The response was overwhelmingly positive, with social media followers praising the new look.

Thursday Night Out: A Record-Breaking Season

In 2025, Thursday Night Out (TNO), Thursday truly became the “New Friday” in Downtown Oak Park. By expanding our theme nights from four to nine—including Juneteenth, Veterans Night, Salsa Night, and Dog Day of Summer—we celebrated our community’s diversity and strengthened our local partnerships.

TNO Participation by the Numbers:

- **Booklets Sold:** 9,101 – 21% increase over 2024.
- **Revenue:** \$227,525 – 21% year-over-year increase.
- **Strategic Partnerships:** 45 non-profit organizations – 73% increase from 2024.
- **Social Media:** Instagram organic views increased by 153%, reaching 94,000 people online!

Shopper’s Reward Program Refresh

To drive even more local spending, we simplified our Shopper’s Reward Program to a “1, 2, 5” framework: **Shop 5 local stores, Spend \$500, and Earn \$50 back.** By reducing the required store visits from seven to five, we made the program more accessible and easier to understand.

The results were remarkable. Demand was so high that we ran out of envelopes a week before the program ended. We also introduced the **Golden Ticket Sweepstakes**, seeding 10 lucky envelopes with a Golden Ticket good for a \$50 DTOP gift certificate and a chance to win a \$500 grand prize. In total, we distributed 1,280 booklets—an 18% increase over last year.

The success of this past year is a testament to the strength of our merchants and the loyalty of our community. And since we are in an Olympic Year, I want to hand out gold medals to our Executive Director, Shanon Williams, and her team.

Thank you for your continued support of Downtown Oak Park.

The Downtown Oak Park Business Alliance presented our annual two-day free jazz festival on Saturday, March 8, from 1 PM to 12 AM, and a Jazz Brunch on Sunday, March 9, from 11 AM to 2 PM. This free event featured live music performed by renowned jazz musicians at more than ten Downtown Oak Park locations.

This promotion was a week-long celebration featuring signature caffeinated drinks from the following participating businesses: Local '84 Cafe (FFC), Jumele Patisserie (formerly Sugar Fixe), Khyber Pass, Kribi Coffee Albion, Kyuramen, Lea's Cafe, Q-BBQ, Smoothie King, Vigo Coffee, Wise Cup, and Wells Street Popcorn. Participants who sipped five or more drinks on our tour and had their passports "stamped received a free travel coffee mug!

The Brew Passport Tour Stirred Up Some Serious Social Media Numbers!

- Year over year, we saw an increase in social media engagement:
 - Instagram views went up by 763%
 - Facebook clicks went up by 206%
 - Facebook reach went up by 80%

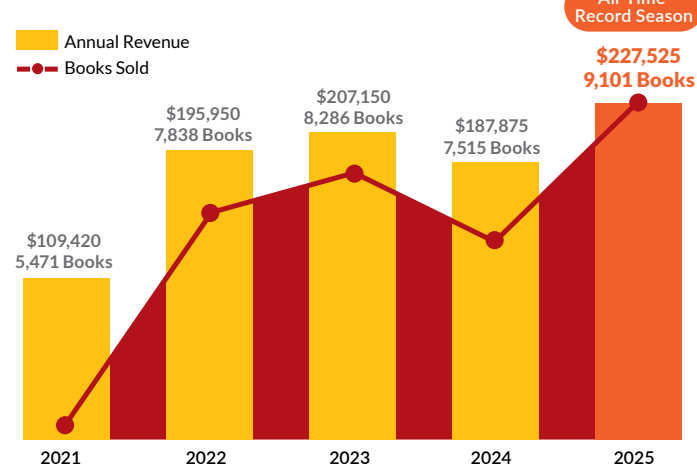

Sales Increased

- Sold 9,101 booklets, marking a 21% increase over the 2024 season.

We decorated the district with seasonal rental displays and our festive lights! Santa made a visit from the North Pole to take pictures and hear gift wish lists!

- **The Polar Express:** Families enjoyed a free 10:00 AM screening at the Lake Theatre.
- **Live Music:** Performances from the Heritage Chorale, Canterbury Carolers, OPRF Show Choir, and Grace Church Carolers throughout the afternoon.
- **Storytelling:** Guest storytellers from the Actor’s Garden shared “Winter Tales from Around the World” at The Book Loft.



Holiday Kick-Off at Our Merchant Advisory Committee (MAC) Meeting

On Wednesday, November 5, at our last MAC meeting of the year, we hosted a holiday kick-off to help our merchants get into the holiday sales spirit! We had holiday decorations, a hot cocoa bar, a catered breakfast, and holiday prizes! We launched the following promotions and events: Small Business Saturday, Shopper’s Reward & Gift Cards, Winterfest: Celebration Around the World, Home for the Holidays, and 2025 Holiday Gift Guide. To launch our Golden Ticket Sweepstakes, we seeded golden tickets in our Shopper’s Reward envelopes, and merchants who “got the golden ticket” won prizes!

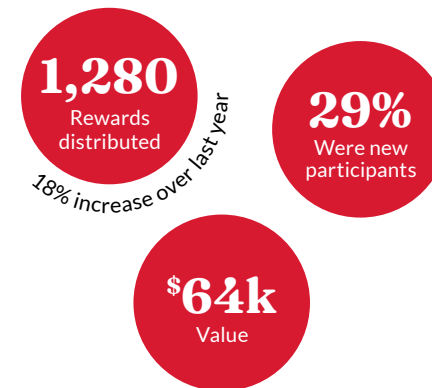
Shopper’s Reward Program Updates

To increase community engagement, we updated and simplified the program and implemented new marketing tactics. Here are the highlights:

- **Program Simplification:** Reduced the required number of store visits from 7 to 5 to boost participation.
- **The “1, 2, 5” Framework:** Rebranded with the catchy slogan: “Shop 5, Spend \$500, Earn \$50.”
- **Multi-Channel Marketing:** Updated all digital and physical assets, including kiosks, posters, and the website.
- **High-Visibility Tactics:** Utilized on-screen ads at Comedy Plex Comedy Club and prominent in-store signage.
- **Merchant Partnerships:** Distributed program envelopes directly into customer shopping bags through local retailers.

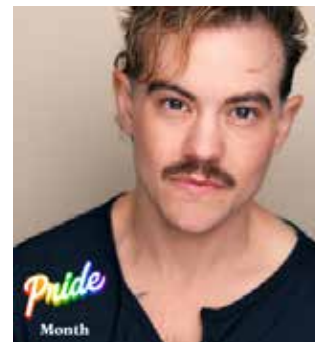

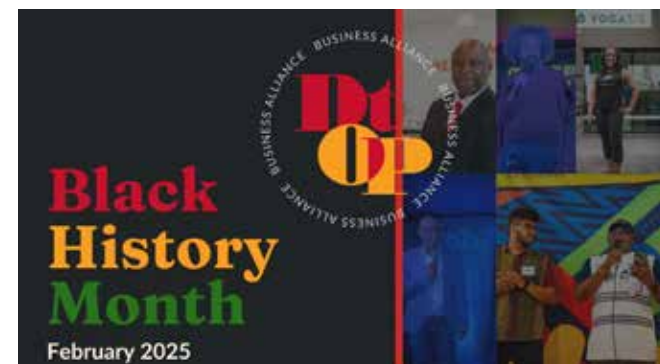

Class is out for the DTOP Business Academy (for now)

Our last class with Triton College was on June 10, at The Nineteenth Century Club. Since launching the program, we have held 10 classes covering topics ranging from Marketing basics to leadership for more than 80 students, including DTOP merchants, Village of Oak Park employees, and non-profit organizations such as the Oak Park River Forest Museum and the Collaboration for Early Childhood.

Celebrated the Oak Park Theatre Festival's 50th Season in Austin Gardens

The Oak Park Festival Theatre is a true gem in the heart of our community. We supported their 50th Season by featuring an interview with the Theatre's Artistic Director, Peter Andersen, and by launching a digital campaign to promote it. We also placed a two-page advert in their program book and ran a co-ad program with our merchants, offering them a discounted half-page ad that ran all summer long.



Our Merchants Mingled at The Book Loft in October

On October 20, we hosted a Merchant Mingle at the Book Loft and enjoyed charcuterie and wine with our community, including Byline Bank, Comedy Plex Comedy Club, Wells Street Popcorn, the Village of Oak Park, and Collaboration for Early Childhood.

Community Partnerships

We are committed to partnering and supporting local organizations throughout the year through events and sponsorship opportunities.



Sustainability Efforts 2024

The Downtown Oak Park Business Alliance (DTOPBA) is committed to promoting sustainable economic development by fostering an eco-friendly environment for its businesses and events.

In 2025, we introduced new sustainability initiatives for Oaktoberfest.

- Water Buggy: Provide attendees with access to free, refillable water stations to eliminate single-use plastic bottles.
- Aluminum Beer Cups instead of plastic
- Recyclable Drinkware for single-serve beer & wine
- Waste Stations throughout the event area offering landfill, recycling, and compost
- All participating restaurants were required to use compostable food containers



- DTOP partnered with the Village of Oak Park to set up waste stations at Thursday Night Out options for landfill, recycling, and compost. We successfully diverted 60% of waste from the landfill.
- DTOP collaborated with local businesses to promote the use of environmentally responsible materials by requiring restaurants to provide compostable containers during Thursday Night Out and Oaktoberfest.
- DTOP also teamed up with the Illinois Green Business Association to raise awareness of sustainable practices among local businesses. IGBA assists small businesses in enhancing their performance through innovative sustainability initiatives.
- DTOP staff are active members of the PlanItGreen Core Team as well as teaming with the Village of Oak Park Sustainability team on numerous initiatives and committees.
- Downtown Oak Park received green certification from the Illinois Green Business Association (IGBA) in 2023.

Grounds and Maintenance

Landscaping

- DTOP contracted Woodlawn's Landscape Company for summer plantings that were installed in the second week of May. A total of 94 containers and 9 flower beds on Lake and Marion were filled with beautiful Cordyline JackII, begonias, Tradescantia Nanouk, and coral impatiens. These plants were chosen for their ability to thrive in both sun and shade.
- The Village of Oak Park invests annually in landscape improvements for challenging areas within Downtown Oak Park. This year, the Village replaced all the shrubs and perennials in the four beds at Westgate and Marion.

Fall Décor

We contracted Woodlawn's Landscaping to fill our 94 containers with vibrant fall mums and ornamental cabbage. They remained in the containers throughout the district until the holiday plantings were installed in November.

Snow Removal

- Snow removal is a primary responsibility of the members of Downtown Oak Park. In 2023, we signed a three-year snow removal contract with McAdams Landscaping. The contract is based on a percentage of snowfalls during the winter season: the less snowfall, the less we pay. We were fortunate this past season to experience light snowfall.
- DTOP contracts for snow removal along all sidewalks in our district and for the creation of "cut-throughs" along Lake Street in the snow embankments between parking stalls and curb lines, further improving accessibility to pay terminals.

- DTOP plans and budgets for complete snow removal every year. If there were a significant snowfall during the holiday season, we would be able to remove all the snow to ensure visitors can access the district.

Holiday Décor

- In 2025, we installed lights on every other tree in our district, alternating between bright and soft white lights. North Marion featured two large illuminated holiday décor pieces placed at the entrance of the Holley Court Garage. Additionally, spheres were hung from the archway, lit in both soft and bright white lights, adding a festive touch to Marion Street.
- We filled half of our 94 containers with greens, pine cones, and birch branches. The flower beds at the intersection of Lake and Harlem were filled with greens and live pine trees. The DTOP sign at the intersection of Forest and Lake showcased three large pine trees adorned with soft white lights. All light poles were decorated with pine roping and soft white lights.



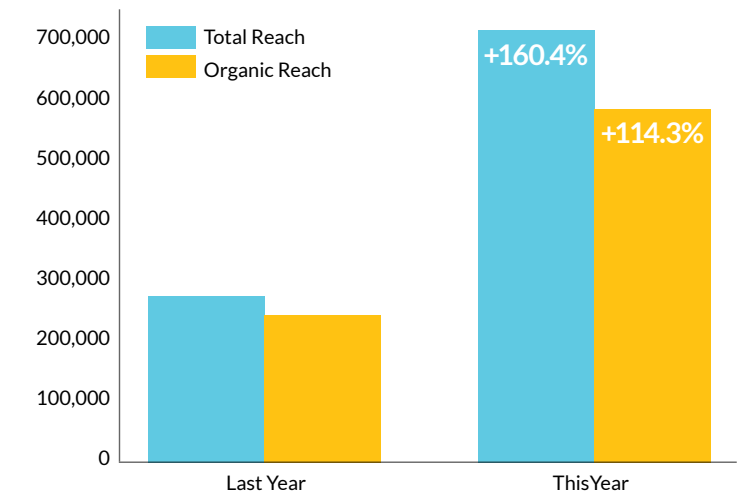

Digital Growth Insights

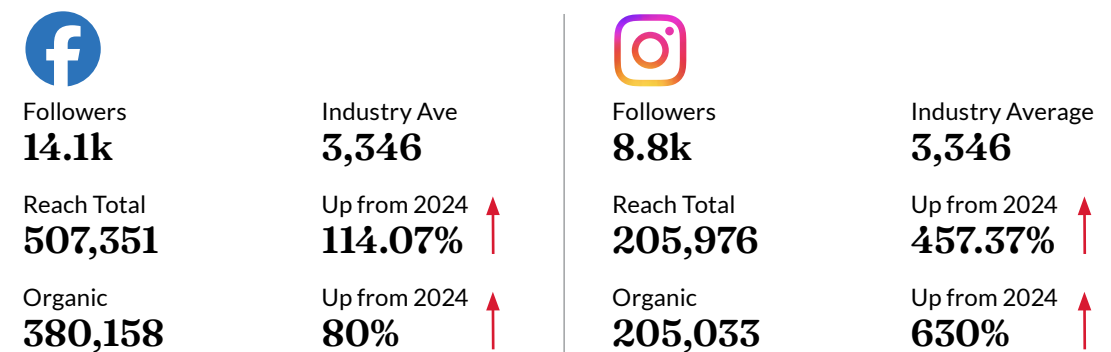
- **Reached Individual Users:** 714,000 unique accounts this year across both platforms.
- **Total Reach Growth:** overall presence jumped by over **160%**, driven heavily by the massive spike in our Instagram audience.
- **Organic Strength:** our organic reach grew by **144.31%**, our content is naturally resonating with users and the algorithms.
- **Platform Mix:** While Facebook provided the largest volume of reach, Instagram was our fastest-growing platform, contributing significantly to this year's total.

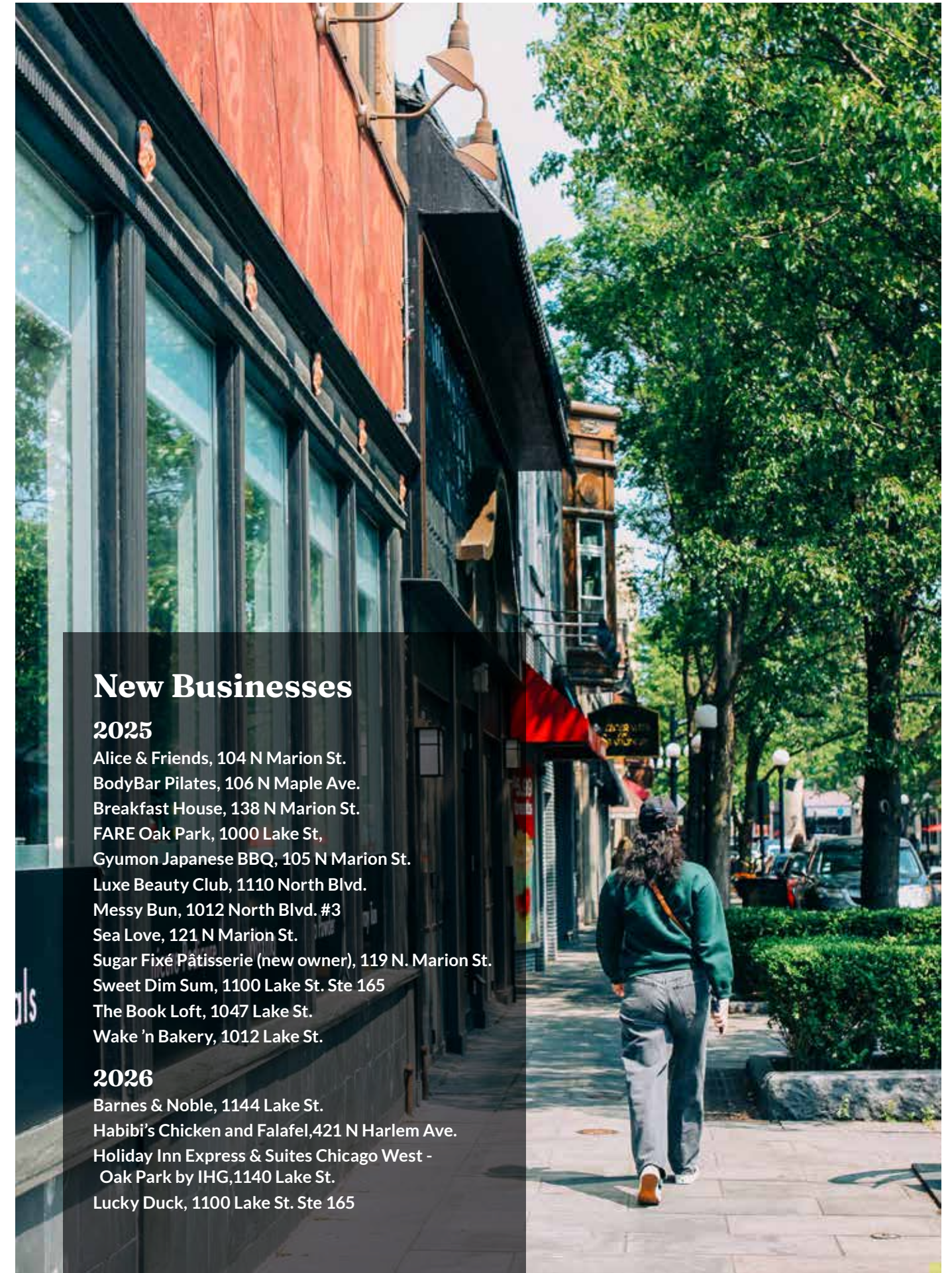
